Project Summary:

On May 21st, 2014 the United States Air Force Academy held its first Sigma Pi Sigma Induction Ceremony in recognition of outstanding students and faculty in USAFA's Department of Physics. SPS President Toni Sauncy presided over the event and was the keynote speaker. Over thirty individuals attended the dinner and nineteen students and faculty members were inducted.

Event Report:

Event planning and organization was led by Dr. Devin Della-Rose, Lt Col Mario Serna, 2^d Lt Ed Schroder, and C3C Anita Dunsmore (SPS Chapter Treasurer). The planning team determined that the event should be held at the Edelweiss Restaurant in Colorado Springs.

For a student to receive a nomination to become a member of the SPS chapter, they first needed to fulfill the GPA requirements. A 3.25 major's GPA was required in their major's classes, and a 3.25 overall GPA was also required for all of their classes. Additionally, students must have completed their 2nd or 1st class year (junior or senior year) to be inducted. Finally, the student needed to receive an endorsement from their faculty advisor in the physics department. Each inductee was presented with a laser-etched piece of marble taken from the terrazzo – the Air Force Academy's marching square. The chapter possesses enough cut spares

to last for several future induction ceremonies. The pieces of marble were engraved with the names of the inductees and the Sigma Pi Sigma emblem. The dinner and ceremony lasted from 5:30 pm to about 8:45 pm and was a great success! The pictures and captions below tell the story of how the event went!


